# Information for Parents and Carers on COVID-19 vaccination for at risk 5 to 11 years old.

Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the Covid-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the <u>Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI)</u>. Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities and other conditions as outlined by the <u>UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in the Green Book</u>. Vaccinations help to increase protection against Covid-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions. Further information is available in the <u>guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years</u> published by UKHSA. We have published some <u>frequently asked questions</u> on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19. Following <u>advice</u> from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children will also be offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The NHS will prepare to extend this non-urgent offer to all children during April.

#### Tilley Yoga working with Bluebell and Jasmine Classes – by Laura Tilley

I have had the pleasure of teaching Yoga to children in Bluebell and Jasmine class. Yoga is a holistic practice and used therapeutically to bring awareness to the body, support self-regulation, increasing motor planning and co-ordination, develop alignment, build strength, increase flexibility, reduce stiffness, support postural development, whilst at the same time giving opportunity for new neural pathways to develop and opening the body up to new ways of moving. This is achieved through specialised breathing techniques; gentle yoga poses and deep relaxation. We begin each session with breathing, modelling slow steady breath. We massage and rotate each joint in the body before moving on to gentle yoga poses. The sessions at Willoughby have been wonderful, with lots of smiles and communication. Every



person has differing ways of moving, so we have worked with this, led by how each person is feeling on the day. We have opened up the hands and feet to assist with better breathing and a couple of the children even worked towards shoulder stands, enjoying the sensation of their bodies being upside down, helping boost energy and releasing endorphins! I left each group (including the staff) very calm and relaxed. A great way to start the day! I work in schools, specialist settings and privately on a 1-2-1 and family basis. The benefits of therapeutic Yoga are incredibly beneficial in so many ways.
